
6.3.4 Research and Development

Best Practice I: Inter- Departmental classes by the various departments.

Context: As we move forward in terms of rapid expansion of higher education and scientific knowledge, the necessity for inter-disciplinary knowledge among students is rapidly increasing. It is highly desired that students must have some amount of inter-disciplinary knowledge in his initial years of higher education so that he/she can encounter the potential problem he/she will face in future. Even the bodies that control and regulate higher education in India are encouraging the students and teachers engaged in higher education to acquire interdisciplinary knowledge.

<u>Practice:</u> The IQAC, in order to increase the awareness about interdisciplinary knowledge, has requested the various departments to arrange classes on topics to be taken by teachers from other departments.

Evidence of Success: It has been generally observed that the students are highly attracted to this type of class as they able to taste a new and unknown thing. Students have requested to arrange more such classes for them.

<u>Problems Encountered and Resource Required:</u> Though there is no big problem in arranging such classes but a slight problem is encountered regarding topic selection and finding a right person who can deliver a successful lecture on the theme. The resource required for this purpose can easily be managed by the departments.

Best Practice II: Classes with ICT Facility

Context: Teaching -learning through ICT is the call of the day now. It makes the class not only attractive and interesting but also helps to understand things quickly and easily. ICT can make a virtual world situation related to the topic and thereby helps students to feel as if they are in that situation live. It is like watching a movie or listening to music when people forget everything and enter in to a world of imagination.

Practice: The major students of the Geography Department are being given the facility to use the ICT. The Department of English has also taken few classes using ICT in the conference hall for their major students.

Evidence of Success: The efforts are highly successful as many complex phenomena can be easily explained with such tools in the simplest of manner and language. The teachers and students attending such classes are found to be highly satisfied.

<u>Problems Encountered and Resource Required:</u> Major problem faced in this case is that such facilities cannot be provided to all the departments by the college authority due to the shortage of funds.

Analysis of the feedback
